Our Village was presented and received a \$1M (One Million Dollar) grant from State Senator Elgie R. Sims on February 28th at our Board Meeting. The grant was obtained thru the Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity to fund a major capital project. The project is the Merrill Avenue Water Main Replacement – 221st to 223rd Street and 223rd to Strassburg Avenue. The project will construct a new water main to replace the aging one that has reached its useful life. Thank you again Senator Sims!

At our February 21st Board Meeting the Restorative Justice Program was approved to move forward in Sauk Village. The Program will help our youth who have a non-violent offense obtain a second chance and avoid possible jail time.

Work On Election Day

Every election in suburban Cook County requires a team of Election Judges and Polling Place Technicians to serve voters at the polls. These poll workers are paid \$250-\$400 depending on the position they work on Election Day.

Visitors can find more information on each topic on the Cook County Clerk's website.

- <u>Election Judges</u> work together to ensure their polling place is running smoothly and voters are properly served. This position earns \$250.
- Polling Place Technicians work directly with the election judges to assist voters and ensure their
 polling place is running smoothly. Polling Place Technicians also have more responsibility for
 setting up and maintaining the voting equipment. Due to the additional responsibility, Polling
 Place Technicians receive more training and higher pay.
- Students also will play a critical role in the elections of 2024. Their votes will help determine
 who leads our nation and their service as poll workers will be critical to our democratic process.

Sauk Village Police Department Violence Prevention & Intervention Program



Program Goals

- Reduce Truancy and improve grades
- Reduce and prevent youth police involvement
- Improve access to mental health services
- Support parents with resources and access to services
- Educate students and parents on the principals of Restorative Justice
- Provide recreational andmotivational resources to students referred to the program.

Reasons for Youth Program Referral:

- Truancy
- · Runaway
- Domestic Battery
- Curfew / Ordinance Violations
- · Lock out / Refusal to return home
- Bullying / School Interventions
- Alcohol/Substance Abuse issues
- First time offenders / criminal offenses not eligible for court referrals.

Referral Process

- Partner agencies can refer to the program by scanning the QR code to access and submit a referral form.
 Parents may self-refer by directly contacting the program director.
- Upon receipt, families undergo an assessment to identify needed services, including clinical assessments, therapy (individual, family, group), mentoring, tutoring, virtual seminars, parent support groups, and other case management services.




